

EXCEPTIONAL ADOLESCENTS WITH SUBJECT EXTENSION (ADV CERT)

The Students with Disabilities 7-12 Generalist extension is for teachers who already possess initial, provisional, permanent, or professional certification as a Classroom Teacher, Grades 7-12, in at least one Subject Area (biology, chemistry, physics, earth science, social studies, mathematics, or English language arts). The leads to certification to become the teacher of record for a special class in the candidate's certification subject area or support, consultant, and collaborative roles.

The coursework develops competencies in understanding principles and policies of special education, and proficiency in assessing and providing evidence-based intervention and instruction for culturally diverse adolescents with a range of disabilities.

Admissions

In addition to the general requirements for admission to the Graduate School of Education, applicants must hold current general education initial, provisional, permanent, or professional certificate in a subject area and a master's degree.
