

# MIDDLE CHILDHOOD SOCIAL STUDIES 7-9 (ADV CERT)

Admissions to this program are currently on hold for the 2024-2025 application cycle. Program faculty are in the process of redesigning this program; the present Bulletin content refers to the version of the program that is on hold. This content will be updated when the program's redesign is complete.

The middle childhood extension program builds on previous coursework in childhood education and leads to certification in social studies teaching for grades 7–9. The program is open to persons who are completing the M.S.T. in childhood education or who already possess initial/professional certification in childhood education or provisional/permanent certification in elementary education (Pre-K–6).

## Admissions

In addition to the general requirements for admission to the Graduate School of Education, applicants must

- Provide evidence of teacher certification in childhood or elementary education, or concurrent pursuit of one of Fordham's childhood education degree programs; and
- Complete or have completed 21 credits or more in history and/or geography, and 30 credits total of coursework in the following areas: U.S. history, non-U.S. history, civics/government/political science, economics, geography, anthropology/culture, sociology, psychology, global connections, and the connections among science, technology, and society.
