The Teaching Students with Disabilities (All Grades, M.S.T., Transitional B) program prepares special education teacher candidates through a rigorous academic program that builds on a foundation of child and youth education and psychology and provides a sequence of field experiences and student teaching requirements. Students with disabilities require dedicated teachers with expertise in learning and development, curriculum content and pedagogy, environmental modifications, and differentiated instruction to accommodate the needs of students with disabilities. This program expands Fordham University's capacity to prepare teacher candidates in the high-needs area of special education. Graduates will be eligible for initial New York State certification in Students with Disabilities in All Grades (pre-Kindergarten through grade 12).

The Transitional B program is an alternative teacher certification program. The New York State Transitional B Certificate permits eligible candidates to be employed as a classroom teacher in a New York State public school while completing a master's degree.
